### Infection prevention and control precautions reminders

Dear Pumpkin families,

Please help us to continue to apply infection prevention and control precautions by keeping your child home if he or she is unwell. We ask you to refrain from bringing your child to Pumpkin if he or she is unwell. For example, if your child has any cold or flu symptoms (such as fever, cough, sore throat, runny nose or shortness of breath).

If your child becomes unwell during their time at Pumpkin, we will contact you and ask you to collect them as soon as possible (within the hour). Your child will then need a clearance letter from a doctor upon returning to our service.

We would also like to remind you of the current restrictions on entry into our service, the following visitors should not be permitted to enter the facility:

- Exclusion of unwell children, visitors and staff
- Those who have returned from overseas in the last 14 days.
- Those who have been in contact with a confirmed case of COVID-19 in the last 14 days (a contact is defined as anyone who has been in contact with a known case, including the 24 hours before the case became symptomatic)
- Additionally, we continue to request that only staff and children enter the classrooms at this time to respect the social distancing advice. Please continue to pick up/drop off your child in front of their classrooms. ***If you arrive at the service and the children are playing outside, please stay behind the gate, we will bring your child in or out.***

provided the children with the alphabet puzzles. We

also gave them the magnetic alphabets, teaching the children with sounding

letters and letter recognition. Also, we spelt out their names on the white board

with the magnetic alphabets. We have used materials like legos, paints and

other bright colours items to attract children to join in the interest of learning

**Nature and natural resources-** Following yesterdays. Children did some

painting on leaves. Upon that interest, we with the children extend further on leaves, trees and

nature. We gathered some items that we can get our hands on and learn more about them. We

came up with pinecones, outer shells from seeds and nuts, we also have seashells. Children were

interested, they came to the table and checked out the supply of nature materials we have put

together for them to investigate. They started to feel the pinecone, it feels rough, uneven. The

seashells feels smooth a bit sharp on the edges, we have different shapes and colours of seashell.

Josiah put the seashell next to his ear. Also, we have some interesting outer shell from seeds and

nuts, we explored through them as well. Children enjoyed playing with them. **Nature excursion-**

decided to go on tour around our own playground and Starfish playground to see what we can discover in our exploring of nature. During when we got to the Starfish playground Cody found yellow grapefruit, he was happy carrying it around the grapefruit with him, he also discovers plant pots. Lisboa enjoys the outdoor, she loves running around. We took the children around to look at many plants we have here at the centre, we have mango trees, avocado trees, we have many



plants and herbs and we collected some of few nature items we found in our tour, we will be pasting in some of those bits and pieces of nature. items we found on the paper and hand them on our clownfish wall. Overall clownfish children enjoyed the outdoor excursion, they explored, investigate and participated with the outdoor. **Shakers-** This morning, Ms Catherine continued with the children's interest in natural materials and resources. She provided the children homemade shakers filled with barks, seed and mini pinecones. Children took interest in them and began to play with the shakers. They like the sounds that comes out of the shakers.



**Free play-** throughout this month of May. Clownfish children look out for their own interest during the free play. Whether indoor or



outdoor. Their main interest during free play were books it was taken interest on daily basis, dolls, kitchen corner and cooking items was always occupied by clownfish children. They also liked singing and dancing to the wiggles. Musical toys were often visited by the children. Medical equipment was seen often played by the children. 

The children also often enjoy using chalk to draw all over our playground and to practise writing their initial letters and numbers!



**The nature interest continues further** – One morning Alicia shared a leaf that she picked up from outside. Miss Pimpini shared an idea, using the leaf as brush for painting! The children chose "yellow, orange, purple" and enjoyed the art experience. On another day this month, the children collected leaves from outside and made a beautiful leaf collage!





**Classic Stories**– The Jellyfish children have two favourite stories at the moment, ‘We are going on a bear hunt’ and ‘Three little pigs’, requesting them daily! The children have been introducing their peers to other classic stories such as ‘Little red riding hood’, ‘Room on the broom’, ‘Wombat stew’, ‘Oh no George’, ‘Classic nursery rhymes’ and ‘Three Billy goats gruff’. Talking about 3 little pigs, Miss Elly has



bought our room a new game about the 3 little pigs. When Miss Alex showed the children the new room addition, they were beyond excited to explore it!



They have continued playing with the game all month! Inside, there has been some house building too with the children building very big and very tall houses together and adding little animals to their



houses. The Jellyfish children have also been engaging in lots of dramatic play, role-playing the stories together. Mid-month, they created their own wolves and little pigs and wolf masks after demonstrating excitement towards the wolves in the stories.



**New equipment** – The Jellyfish children have been enjoying the new resources, such as the new kitchen outdoors and building together with the new Lego and wooden blocks. The children have been having a lot of fun using our new Lego blocks to build, take apart, assemble, invent and construct as they cooperate with and work collaboratively with



each other. They have also been combining the new Lego blocks with our new wooden blocks as they image and express creativity through their social play!



**Shape painting and National Sorry day** – Since we were having a rainy indoor day on the 26<sup>th</sup>, Miss Alex suggested some painting. Alicia said, “Red and yellow. Balloon!”. What a good idea! Since she has been bringing balls in lately and suggested balloon, we discussed the circle shape and decided to do some shapes painting today, using the colours Alicia



suggested. The children made square, triangle, rectangle and of course, circle print shapes! And to mark Sorry day, Miss Alex brought up the colours chosen by Alicia for our painting experience, explaining that we can find them, along with black, in the Aboriginal flag. We spoke about the meaning of the three colours: the red earth, sun and people. We also read an Aboriginal story called Warnayarra, the rainbow snake. The children enjoyed discussing all the colours of the snake too!

**Origami...** Throughout May the Lionfish and Starfish have engaged with the origami process. Earlier in the month as an extension from a peer's news we used coloured paper to make our own dragonflies. This led to the interest of making paper airplanes and exploring the distance and height they can fly. To further this Miss Nicole made a target game which provided the opportunity for the Starfish and Lionfish to attempt to throw their planes through different sized targets.



**Construction...** The Lionfish and Starfish have been busy builders using various resources to invent and construct. The favourite resources being lego, colourful lego, junior engineer kit, magnetic blocks,



mobilo and mega blocks. We have had various houses, towers, boats, animals, cars built with the list going on. The Lionfish and Starfish have expressed great pride and satisfaction with their creations and now display it on our construction shelf. The Lionfish and Starfish have shared their creations made at home as a result of our news topic being construction. There



also has been countless conversations regarding lego masters.



**Bikes and Cars...** When outside throughout May the Lionfish and Starfish have frequently requested to have the bikes and car brought out. When doing so expressing concern for safety of themselves and others through putting on their helmets and assisting





others to put on theirs. While pedalling around the outside environment the Lionfish and Starfish have showed each other how they go fast and how they can pedal forwards and backwards. On countless occasions a road has been created using chalk, with a pedestrian crossing, roundabouts. The Lionfish and Starfish have also pretended they were traffic lights through calling our red light and green light in order for their peers to stop and go.

The Lionfish and Starfish have engaged with the indoor and outdoor home corner to cook and have various tea parties and birthday parties. When doing so using the dolls to further this

**Gross Motor Games...** While outdoors the Lionfish and Starfish have effectively employed the use of their gross motor skills and abilities. The Lionfish and Starfish have used the

Once finished moving through the obstacle with countless smiles and laughs as well as encouraging and congratulating their peers.



**Literacy and Numeracy...** The Lionfish and Starfish have been provided with opportunity write using their name and number writing sheets. The Lionfish and Starfish have improved greatly and now are challenged through not only tracing their names but




writing it themselves. Lionfish and Starfish have worked with educators to play various literacy and numeracy games on the prowise. This including
